

# DO YOU WORK WITH YOUNG PEOPLE WHO MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE NATIONAL REDRESS SCHEME?

## Who is eligible for Redress?

### Anyone who:

- experienced sexual abuse in an institution prior to 1 July 2018,
- will turn 18 before 30 June 2028,
- is an Australian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Australia.



## What can you do to support them?

- Let them know what they are eligible for.
- Explain and simplify the information so they understand.
- Be there to answer any questions they may have.
- Acknowledge the trauma of their experience and that the application process may be difficult.
- Reassure them they are not alone, and support is out there.
